Mayor Bass' Executive Directive 4



<u>Executive Directive 4</u> seeks to identify and address the barriers small businesses face. In the Mayor's directive, several City departments, including DCR, have been invited to create new or streamline existing processes with the goal of business creation and growth.

What DCR is doing:

- Reinstating processing timelines
- Streamlining annual licensing
- Providing fee waivers and fee deferrals & launching a fee study
- Enacting progressive enforcement tools
- Creation of LBER, "parent" records
- Ongoing Social Equity Programs

Legislative Update



SB 51:

• <u>SB 51</u> (Bradford) is a critical bill that would retroactively extend the State's provisional licensing application deadline beyond March 31, 2023. On July 11, it passed in the Business & Professions Committee. The bill will be scheduled for a vote in the Appropriations committee and then the <u>Assembly</u> floor before heading to the Governor's desk. The Los Angeles <u>City Council</u> adopted a resolution in <u>support</u> of this bill.

AB 1565:

AB 1565 (Jones-Sawyer) bill provides \$15,000,000 to the State of California's Department of Cannabis Control
effective July 1, 2028, and every fiscal year thereafter for Social Equity programs and assistance. The bill is
currently in the Senate Appropriations Committee where it successfully passed its first vote on July 10. On July
6, the Mayor concurred with the Los Angeles <u>City Council</u> in adoption of a resolution in <u>support</u> of this bill.

SB 512:

 SB 512 (Bradford) would remove the excise tax on "gross receipts." The bill successfully passed through the Senate and was referred to the Assembly's Revenue & Tax Committee on June 15. The Los Angeles <u>City Council</u> introduced a resolution in <u>support</u> of this bill.







Every licensed cannabis business in the City of Los Angeles must participate in this survey and complete it annually by submitting the GFHR Survey jotform.



Pro Bono/Low Bono Legal Services Survey

Pro Bono/Low Bono Authorization Agreement

The Los Angeles County Bar Association's Cannabis Section, in partnership with DCR, has created a Pro Bono/Low Bono Legal Assistance program which will operate through the Bar Association's Smart Law Referral Service for Social Equity Applicants.

The goals of this referral resource are to promote fair and equitable participation in the licensed commercial cannabis industry, and to foster a level playing field as it relates to access to legal counsel, and help deter predatory practices targeting the social equity community. The Pro Bono program provides up to 10 hours of free legal advice for verified Social Equity Individual Applicants (SEIA) who meet eligibility criteria. In addition, SEIA's can access the Low Bono program that allows those who qualify to receive up to 30 hours of legal advice at a discounted rate of \$35 per hour.

LA SEED Rental Assistance Grant Program CANNABIS REGULATION COMMISSION

In partnership with Elevate Impact LA, the City of Los Angeles Department of Cannabis Regulation is disbursing \$5 million in funding from the 2022 Cannabis Equity Grant for Local Jurisdictions.

SEED Rental Assistance Grant funds may be used for the following purposes:

- To pay rent or a security deposit pursuant to a fully executed commercial lease
- To finance up to one month of back rent due on a fully executed commercial lease
- To secure a binding Letter of Intent by paying the required security deposit
- To assist with build out or construction costs for the purposes of renovating a location to operate a licensed commercial cannabis storefront retail location

• SEED 1.0

o The SEED 1.0 Rental Assistance Grant Program utilizes \$4 million in funding from the Cannabis Equity Grant for Local Jurisdictions to provide financial assistance to Phase 3 Retail Round 1 Verified Social Equity Individual Applicants and Licensees.

o Applicants may apply to receive a financial grant of up to \$50,000.

<u>First Disbursement Course Requirement</u>: Commercial Leases & Contract Negotiations Parts 1 & 2.

<u>Second Disbursement Course Requirement</u>: Business Planning & Operational Development

<u>Third Disbursement Course Requirement</u>: Third "elective" course may be chosen by the applicant but must be selected from the DCR LMS.

LA SEED Rental Assistance Grant Program

- The SEED 2.0 Rental Assistance Grant Program utilizes \$1 million in funding from the Cannabis Equity Grant for Local Jurisdictions to provide financial assistance to verified Social Equity Individual Applicants and Licensees who: (1) are seeking Temporary Approval or a License for license type that is <u>not</u> retail commercial cannabis activity; (2) have passed the Pre-Application Review stage with a compliant proposed Business Premises; and (3) have executed lease and/or binding Letter of Intent for that proposed Business Premises.
- \circ Applicants may apply to receive a financial grant of \$10,000.

Licensing Program Updates: Council File no. 21-1083-S1



Beginning in April 2022, the Department of Cannabis Regulation (DCR) met with stakeholders to identify and develop a course of action to improve local commercial cannabis regulation.

On October 13, 2022, DCR transmitted its recommend amendments to Article 4, Chapter X of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to reorganize, clarify and establish necessary procedures for the administration of the City's commercial cannabis licensing and Social Equity Program.

Licensing Program Updates: Council File no. 21-1083-S1



On February 28, 2023, the Los Angeles City Council requested the Office of the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance to effectuate the recommended amendments.

On May 16, 2023, the Planning and Land Use Management Committee considered a draft ordinance to effectuate the amendments approved by City Council on February 28, 2023.

On May 23, 2023, the City Council considered a draft ordinance to effectuate the amendments approved on February 28, 2023.

Licensing Program Updates: Council File no. 21-1083-S1 cont.



Several new subdivisions would be added to the LAMC:

- DCR shall cease accepting new Temporary Approval (TA) Applications from General Applicants by May 31, 2023.
 - TA renewal Applications, that are timely filed, will be accepted through the 2027 renewal period (February 28, 2027).
- DCR shall cease accepting new TA Applications from Social Equity Applicants by July 31, 2023.
 - TA renewal Applications, that are timely filed, will be accepted through the 2027 renewal period (February 28, 2027).
- Temporary Approval Licenses issued for calendar year 2027 may not be renewed and shall expire on December 31, 2027 after 11:59pm.

Licensing Program Updates: Council File no. 21-1083-S1 cont.



- Temporary Approval Applications abandoned for any reason after July 1, 2023, shall be refiled as an Annual Application.
- The refiling process shall be initiated through the DCR Licensing Portal within three (3) calendar years of the date DCR notifies the Applicant by electronic mail that the original Application is deemed abandoned.
 - This extension of time also applies to TA Applications abandoned in 2022.
- Annual Application process will be open to all Applicants.
- The inspection requirements shift to after Annual Licenses are issued.
- An Operating Permit will be issued after the Final Inspection is passed.

Licensing Program Updates: Council File no. 21-1083-S1 cont.



- DCR will publish updated Rules and Regulations to reflect the adopted changes.
- DCR will updates forms and information procedure bulletins to reflect the adopted changes.
- The DCR Licensing Portal will be updated and the Annual Application record will be available in June 2023 to all Applicants.
- The Executive Director may begin approving Annual Applications this summer.
- The Cannabis Regulation Commission may begin approving Annual Applications this fall.

- All Operators must submit Attestation of Compliance with Rules & Regs (ENF-3003-FORM).
- Due within 30 days of the beginning date of operations.

- **DCR <u>may</u> contact the Operator prior to issuance of NTC (if applicable).
- DCR conducts investigation
- DCR issues NTC if violation(s) is found.
- NTC does not include penalty fees, only administrative costs.

- DCR issues NOV if violations are not corrected within the time frame allotted in the NTC.
- NOV is appealable to an Administrative Hearing Officer.
- NOV carries hefty penalties \$\$\$\$.
- DCR may suspend or revoke the license if compliance is not achieved or penalties are not paid.

"Level 1 Owners" are the natural persons or entities that own the Applicant or Licensee entity directly without any intervening entities or persons. If a Level 1 Owner is an entity, the CEO or President, or equivalent executive position, may sign on behalf of the entity.

Emblem Placard Program and Health Permit



- Facilitated in coordination with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (DPH),
 specifically through their Cannabis Compliance and Enforcement Program (CCEP).
- DPH conducts health and safety inspections for the City of Los Angeles per an executed agreement.
- Only retail cannabis facilities can participate in the Emblem Placard Program.
- <u>All commercial cannabis businesses</u> are required to obtain a Health Permit from DPH prior to DCR's issuance of an Operating Permit for that business.
- The Site Evaluation Process is a modified, less costly process to obtain a Health Permit; does not require submittal of plans to DPH;
- ***Only <u>existing</u> cannabis businesses with Temporary Approval from DCR are eligible to request a site evaluation provided the location has all the required City permits and approvals (Certificate of Occupancy for the use).

Emblem Placard Program and Health Permit



- DCR conducted a <u>webinar</u> alongside DPH about the Commercial Cannabis Facility
 Public Health Inspections Compliance and Emblem Program on April 28, 2022.
- DPH verifies items that impact the public health and safety such as:
 - General Sanitation (vermin, construction requirements)
 - Equipment standards and requirements
 - Water supply safety
 - Produce safety (storage, packaging)
 - o Employee health, hygiene

Emblem Placard Program



DCR Performs Research

DCR staff reviews building permits and C of Os' on LADBS online building records search database and saves latest records + BP Diagram provided to DCR by Licensee. Verification form is initiated for LADBS to complete.

DCR Publishes Eligible Locations

DCR publishes the list of Business Premises locations on its website.

Placard is Issued by LACDPH

If the location passes the Site Evaluation, the Emblem Placard will be issued upon payment of the Health Permit Fee.

DBS verifies use at BP locations

LADBS reviews records provided by DCR and determines if the permitted use per building records is consistent with the retail use as proposed by licensee; DBS completes verification form and returns to DCR.

LACDPH Coordinates Site Evaluation with Licensee

LACDPH only accepts site evaluation requests from licensees whose Business Premises locations have been verified to have all the required permits and approvals from the City (i.e. Certificate of Occupancy).






